Prevention Matters

When I began working at JTNN 10 years ago, substance abuse prevention was a foreign concept to me. I'd only heard the words "risk factor" in relation to health issues like heart disease, diabetes or cancer. Since then I've learned risk factors can occur within the family like a chaotic home environment or outside the family such as relationships in schools with peers and teachers. I've had an opportunity to see evidence based prevention programs like Teen Intervene and BASICS in action and applaud the great work conducted by JTNN's subgrant recipients: ACCEPT, The Children's Cabinet, Big Brothers Big Sisters, Boys & Girls Club of Truckee Meadows, Quest Counseling and Consulting, Washoe County School District, and University of Reno's Office of Student Conduct.

Studies indicate children with poor academic performance and inappropriate behavior at ages 7-9 are more likely to abuse alcohol and other drugs by age 14 or 15. The National Institute on Drug Abuse suggests the goal of prevention "is to change the balance between risk and protective factors so that protective factors outweigh risk factors." This can be done through the family and community. The family can offer parental involvement, consistent rules, and discipline, and the community can offer extracurricular activities and bonds with institutions like schools and religious organizations. That's why the programming provided by JTNN and our subgrant recipients is
